

2017 List of Grants

The following grants were awarded between March and May 2017. Due to the increase in demand, we now accept applications through the year.

1. All Saints Primary and the Oratory Primary (London)

£1,200 To support the introduction of Classics at Key Stage 2 in South West London primary schools.

2. Beechen Cliff School (Bath)

A single grant of £3,000 Beechen Cliff School to introduce Latin at GCSE, with the goal of getting 20 pupils to examination level by 2019. The school will also support Latin taster days for two feeder primary schools.

3. Blackpool 6th Form Hub (Blackpool)

A single grant of £2,350 to support the introduction of Latin at two more local primary schools, Blackpool Gateway Academy and Westcliff Primary School.

4. Cathedral Catholic Primary School (Lancaster)

A single grant of £150 to support teacher training for 5 primary teachers introducing Latin to 120 pupils to Latin at Key Stage 2 as part of the mainstream curriculum

5. Cotham School (Bristol)

In kind funding to support a bursary for Cotham School to introduce GCSE Ancient History.

6. Harris Primary Academy Crystal Palace (London)

A single grant of £600 to support the introduction of Latin on the curriculum for Key Stage 2 students with training provided by Dr Arlene Holmes-Henderson

7. Kings' College Guildford (Surrey)

A single grant of £300 to support training on integrating Classical Civilisation and mythology into the Key Stage 3 curriculum.

8. Richmond School (Yorkshire)

A single grant of £3,840 to support the Head of Department to continue teaching Classical Civilisation at GCSE and A2 for another year in order to relieve pressure on the remaining member of staff during the period of transition.

9. Reigate College (Surrey)

A single grant of £2,394.20 to support the introduction of the Level 2 Latin and Roman qualification (WJEC) to the college after it successfully ran a Classical Civilisation lunchtime club. The school will also work in partnership with a number of local schools to deliver Classics enrichment activities.

10. Stoke Newington School (London)

A single grant of £880 to support the introduction of GCSE Latin and longer term plans for Latin A Level.

11. Thameside Primary School (Thurrock)

A single grant of £200 to train for 20 teachers and support the introduction of Latin to 320 pupils in KS2, who will study Latin as part of the mainstream curriculum.

12. University of Bristol Hub (Bristol)

Three annual grants of £6,250 to support the expansion of the hub. The programme will support training for staff in 20 schools and the introduction of Latin in 10 primary schools as well as two events every academic year.

13. William Tyndale School (London)

A single grant of £600 to support two days of training for teachers to introduce Latin to the mainstream curriculum for pupils in years 3 and 4. This provision will extend to pupils in years 5 and 6 in 2018, reaching a total of 240 students.

14. Yoxford and Peasenhall School (Norfolk)

A single grant of £800 to support training to introduce Latin to two primary schools in Norfolk.
