

2016/ 2017 List of Grants

The following grants were awarded in the 3rd tranche of funding round 6 (September 2016 – December 2016). In 2016, we awarded £201,829 in grants.

Following a recent increase in demand for grants, we are pleased to advise that we are now accepting applications throughout the year. 2017 grants made until the end of February are listed below tranche 3 of 2016.

2016, 3rd tranche

- 1. Bean School & Sedley's Church of England Primary School (Dartford)**
A single training grant of £70 to support training for 3 teachers to introduce Minimus to 30 pupils at Key Stage 2.
- 2. Bristol Free School (Bristol)**
A single grant of £7,000 to train 3 staff and review and strengthen the teaching of Latin at Key Stage 3 reaching 90 pupils and to improve teaching at Key Stage 4 benefiting a further 30 pupils.
- 3. Chadwell Primary School (Essex)**
A single training grant of £250 to support Minimus trainer Linda Soames to train 2 teachers at Chadwell Primary School to set up an after school club for 12 pupils.
- 4. Charles Dickens Primary School (London)**
A single grant of £300 to support Linda Soames to train teachers to run an after school Latin club for around 20 pupils. There are longer term ambitions to make Latin part of the mainstream curriculum.
- 5. Clevedon School (Somerset)**
A single grant of £3,785 to support the introduction of a Latin and Classical Civilisation course for all 400 pupils at Key Stage 3, years 7, 8 and 9.
- 6. Fitzalan High School (Cardiff)**
A single grant of £300 to support the purchasing of textbooks.
- 7. Harris Federation (London)**
Training has been provided for Harris Rainham, Harris Westminster and Harris Bromley in order to support the teaching of Latin.

8. Mandeville Primary School (St Albans)

A single training grant of £250 to put Minimus on the curriculum for all pupils in years 5 and 6 (180) and to receive support for advice on assessment and differentiation.

9. Sidney Stringer School (Coventry)

A single grant of £3,070 to support a temporary part-time Classics teacher.

10. St Ursula's Convent School (London)

£200 plus expenses to support a further days training at St Ursula's School in Greenwich, supporting the introduction of an after school club.

11. University of Bristol Hub (Bristol)

A single grant of £10,000 to support the establishment of Classics hub in partnership with Bristol University.

12. University of Cambridge (Cambridge)

A single grant of £5,500 to support a 2 day INSET course covering all aspects of the revised GCSE curriculum, targeting both teachers new to Classical Civilisation and Ancient History and those who are keen to enhance their subject knowledge.

13. University of Cambridge (Cambridge)

A single grant of £2,000 to support the development of a Classics hub in Cambridge

14. University Hub & Manchester Classical Association (Manchester)

A top-up grant of over one year of £11,500 to continue work in and around Manchester reaching Primary and Secondary students from over 10 schools.

2017 grants, January – March

1. Arbourthorne and Gleadless Primary schools (Sheffield)

A single grant of 2,500 to introduce Latin at Arbourthorne and Gleadless Primary schools.

2. CfA/NUT Partnership

A single grant of £2,000 to support the costs of trainers to support training costs for a course that will train 30 teachers from across the UK to teach primary Latin

3. Chipping Campden School (Gloucestershire)

A single grant of £2,908 to introduce Classics to all 600 pupils at Key Stage 3 through a 20 week one hour course covering the Cambridge Latin course and aspects of classical culture and literature.

- 4. Christopher Whitehead School (Worcestershire)**
A single grant of £5,400 to support the introduction of Latin for all year 7 pupils, after school Latin for KS3 and outreach work with 2 local schools reaching 120 pupils.
- 5. Colston's Girls' School (Bristol)**
A single grant of £900 to introduce a Greek club for 20 pupils at Key Stages 3 and 4.
- 6. Greig City Academy (London)**
A grant of £12,300 to train 10 new primary schools to introduce Classics in the South East, pilot new term two course materials for Classics Club Junior, creative training videos and train an additional trainer to meet growing demand for the course.
- 7. Into University**
A single grant of £1,500 to support a pilot course with 350 Key Stage 2 students attending Into University's 21 after school clubs at centres across the country.
- 8. Liverpool Primary Schools (Liverpool)**
£750 to support an introductory training day for 11 schools in Liverpool to the merits of Latin with a view to introducing Latin on the curriculum.
- 9. Manningtree School (Essex)**
A single grant of £2,550 to support the training of teachers to introduce Latin at Key Stage 3.
- 10. Middlezoy and Othery Primary Schools (Somerset)**
A single grant of £700 to support the introduction of Latin in two primary schools.
- 11. Orchard School Federation (Bristol)**
A single grant of £9,000 to introduce Latin to all 300 pupils in years 7 and 8 and work with 3 other schools reaching over 700 pupils.
- 12. Primary Latin Project**
A single grant of £3,550 to support training and resources for a group of 20 Minimus trainers who will train teachers in primary schools to introduce Latin at Key Stages 1 and 2.
- 13. Scottish Classics Network (Scotland)**
A grant of £2,000 to support research leading to the establishing of a Classics hub in Scotland.
- 14. Shavington Academy (Cheshire)**
A single grant of £500 to train a new Classical Civilisation teacher and support a school trip and taster day for year 8 students.
- 15. St Vincent's Catholic Primary School (London)**
From January 2017, St Vincent's Primary school in Mill Hill will be launching a lunchtime Minimus club for 20 pupils interested in Latin led initially by a volunteer.

16. Turner Academies (East Kent)

A single grant of £9,000 to introduce Latin across the Turner Academy schools reaching pupils in KS1, KS2 & KS3.

17. University of Leeds Research (Leeds)

A single grant of £2,000 to support the research on the state of Classics in Leeds and Bradford school and the planning of expansion of work in state schools in those areas.
