### 2017-18 List of Grants

The following grants were awarded between October 2017 and April 2018. Due to the increase in demand, we now accept applications through the year.

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- 1. Aldridge School**  
A grant of £262.08 to train two teachers to teach ancient history to 60 KS4 children on the curriculum.
- 2. All Saints Upton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School**  
A grant of £150.00 to train a teacher to teach Latin to 120 children in Key Stage 2 on the curriculum.
- 3. Bishop Challoner Catholic Federation of Schools**  
A grant of £900 to support the training of two teachers to set up a Latin club for 30 Key Stage 3 children.
- 4. Bishop Luffa School**  
In kind grant support for Ancient Greek resources.
- 5. Brighthouse High School**  
A grant of £700 to teach 30 Key Stage 3 children Latin on the curriculum.
- 6. Bure Valley School**  
A grant of £300 to train three teachers and to teach 30 Key Stage 2 children Latin on the curriculum.
- 7. Camden School for Girls**  
A grant of £4,500.00 over three years, to support the teaching of GCSE Greek.
- 8. Camelot Primary School**  
A grant of £700 to introduce Latin on the curriculum at Key Stage 2 for all pupils in years 5 and 6 (180) and to train 20 teachers.
- 9. Cantell School**  
In kind support through donation of 20 second books.
- 10. Cardinal Vaughan Memorial School**  
A grant of £150 to support a Key Stage 3 Greek Club reaching 20 students.
- 11. Christopher Whitehead Language College**  
In kind support through donation of second hand books.
- 12. Classical Association of Scotland, Glasgow work**  
A grant of £5,430.00 to support the introduction of a 10-week Latin and Classics course to 10 primary schools in East Glasgow with over 400 pupils.
- 13. Classical Association of Scotland**  
A grant of £8,000 to support a strategy for increasing take up of Classics across Scotland including the costs of the Classics Network Coordinator.
- 14. Dartford Grammar School**

A grant of £150 to support Modern Foreign Language teachers to day to encourage them to introduce Latin.

A grant of £880 to support 10 training sessions on GCSE Latin prose and poetry to enhance the quality of GCSE teaching by non-specialists at the school.

Support in kind for training to teach 94 pupils the Maximum Classics course, on the curriculum.
- 25. Langford and Wilberforce Primary Schools**  
A grant of £600 to teach 240 Key Stage 2 children Latin on the curriculum at Langford Primary School and 84 Key Stage 2 children Latin on the curriculum.

A grant of £2,393.16 to train teachers to run a Latin club for 25 pupils at Key Stage 3.

A grant of £1,050 to support the introduction of a Classics club for 30 pupils in Key Stage 3 and also for student and teacher enrichment events.
- 37. University of Birmingham**  
A grant of £8,470 to support the appointment of a co-ordinator to run a Birmingham and West Midlands Classics network and supporting Classics teaching in over 20 schools.
- 38. University of Kent**  
A grant of £500 to support the creating of a database of primary schools in Kent.
- 39. University of Manchester**  
A grant of £10,768 to support the running of the Manchester Classics Network, supporting Classics teaching in the Manchester area.
- 40. University of Warwick £2,300.00**  
A grant of £2,300 to support research into the creation of the new Classics network at the university.

In Kind support and training to introduce Ancient Greek to 90 pupils on the curriculum at Key Stage 2.

A grant of £250 to teachers to run a Latin club for 106 pupils at Key Stage 2.

In Kind training and support to run a Latin club for 28 pupils at Key Stage 2.
