# FREE LATIN AND GREEK TRAINING

Wednesday 28th August: 10.00 - 17.30

Thursday 29th August: 9.00 - 16.00

Following the success of the courses we ran in 2017 and 2018, this summer we are pleased to be able to increase the range of groups on offer and introduce specific sessions for primary teachers. We are keen to ensure that these courses are as beneficial as possible to those who attend and therefore we will tailor the exact structure and content of each class in response to need. The details below are intended as a guide.

## PRIMARY GROUPS

Teachers are welcome to attend one or both days.

### Day 1: Wednesday 28th August – Introducing Latin and Classics at primary level

This course will include hands-on learning activities allowing teachers to learn some Latin, understand its place within the Key Stage 2 languages curriculum and explore opportunities to develop and enrich students' literacy skills through Latin and Classics.

### Day 2: Thursday 29th August – Introducing Ancient Greek at primary level

Over the course of the day, teachers will explore how learning about the language, culture and stories of Ancient Greece can be used to enrich the Key Stage 2 curriculum. Specific workshops will run on:

- **Mega Greek:** a free 10 week course which gives pupils from Years 4-6 the opportunity of learning the Ancient Greek language, as well as discovering how its culture permeates the modern world.
- **Teaching literacy and history through the Greek myths:** Caroline Musgrove from the Cambridge Schools Classics Project will discuss the Primary Ancient Greeks resources.
- **Learning Greek with Basil the Frog:** Charlie Andrew from Classics for All will introduce teachers to the new Basil Batrakhos coursebook which aims to give students aged 9-12 an enjoyable, accessible and useful introduction to the language, stories and life of Greece in its classical heyday.

## SECONDARY GROUPS

All secondary sessions will run as 2 day courses.

**Group 1 - Beginners' Greek:** This group is aimed at those who are new to Greek. Some prior knowledge of the alphabet would be helpful but not essential. The course will focus on the basic elements of grammar and the main textbook used will be John Taylor's Greek to GCSE Part 1.

**Group 2 - Beginners' Latin:** This course will use Cambridge Latin Course Book 1 and will provide a solid introduction to the basics of Latin grammar.

**Group 3 - Intermediate Latin:** This group is aimed to support teachers who already have some knowledge of Latin and who would now like to teach up to GCSE level. The course will cover the language requirements up to GCSE level. Other topics such as teaching GCSE on reduced time or tackling the Literature and Culture (OCR)/Roman Civilisation (Eduqas) options may also be covered depending on the interests of those in the group.

**Group 4 – Teaching Literature at GCSE:** This group will be led by an OCR Lead Examiner and will focus specifically on teaching the literature components of Latin and/or Greek GCSE.

## PRACTICALITIES

These courses are **free** to attend. Classics for All hopes to be able to provide accommodation on Wednesday night (and Tuesday if absolutely necessary) for those teachers who will be travelling to the course **from outside Greater London**. Room availability is limited so this accommodation will be allocated according to need and geographical distance. Do complete the registration form ASAP if you would like to reserve accommodation.

We hope that you will be able to claim back any travel expenses from your school but Classics for All may be able to make a modest contribution towards train travel if this is not possible.
